During the entrance/procession with the holy gifts at the Divine Liturgy, there is a pious custom for the celebrant to remember the names for whom the Divine Liturgy is being offered. This custom is often done in Melkite Churches, though not in other traditions who also use the Liturgy of St. John Chrysostom, as it is only a matter of convenience, expediency, or discretion. The necessary place for mentioning the intentions for the Divine Liturgy is during the Proskomedia (offertory), done typically before the Liturgy starts, not within the hearing of all present. Please be assured that if the priest fails to remember your intentions there is no intention to slight the requester nor that your intention request goes unfulfilled.
